

The notation '[NP]' in a rule of the sailing instructions (SIs) means that a boat may not protest another boat for breaking that rule. This changes RRS 60.1(a).

1. RULES

1.1. The event is governed by the rules as defined in *The Racing Rules of Sailing*.

2. CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1. Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect, except that any change to the schedule of races will be posted by 2000 on the day before it will take effect.

3. COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- **3.1.** Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at [https://www.grafham.org/sailing-racing/club-racing.html]
- CODE OF CONDUCT (Does not apply)
- SIGNALS MADE ASHORE
 - **5.1.** Postponement of the first race of each day may be signalled by an announcement over the club PA system and/ or a flag flown from the flagpole in front of the wet-bar.
 - **5.2.** Abandonment of the day's racing may be signalled by an announcement over the club PA system and/or a flag flown from flagpole 1 on the foreshore.

6. SCHEDULE OF RACES

- **6.1.** Three races are scheduled for each day's racing.
- **6.2.** The warning signal for the first start of the first race of each day will not be before 10:57
- 7. CLASS FLAGS (Does not apply)
- 8. RACING AREA (Does not apply
- 9. COURSES
 - **9.1.** The Race Committee boat will be stationed upwind of the leeward mark. It will remain in this position for the duration of the race.
 - **9.2.** Indicator boards will show the initial letters of course marks. 'Special' or temporary course marks are shown as a white disc. The background colour of the boards indicates whether marks are to be left to port (red) or starboard (green).
 - 9.3. On all courses, the Windward Mark shall be left to port.
 - **9.4.** Boats which fail to start or finish correctly or to sail the course as set and thus fail to comply with RRS28 will be disqualified without protest or a hearing.
 - 9.5. Boats shall sail the course displayed on the committee boat see appendix 1 and 3.
 - **9.6.** The upwind gate and the finish line will be between the mast of the Committee boat displaying an orange flag and a Dan buoy carrying an orange flag.
 - 9.7. Boats must pass through the upwind gate formed by the committee boat and the finishing mark on each lap. Boats that fail to pass through the upwind gate will not be disqualified but will be credited only with the number of laps they have sailed correctly. The Race Committee shall record the finishing time or place as appropriate as well as noting on which laps that the gate was missed. Boats may apply for redress if they believe an error has been made. This changes RRS63.1
 - **9.8.** Boats shall not sail through the Start/Finish line on the way to a leeward course mark. The Start / Finish line and the upwind gate shall be treated as an obstruction to boats sailing to the leeward course mark.
 - **9.9.** One design fleets (+ slow double-handers), sail the course on the Port side of the committee boat.



- **9.9.1.** The symbol 'TS', displayed with 3 course boards on the Port side of the Committee boat, indicates that a Triangle/sausage shaped course is to be sailed. An alternative 'ST' displayed will signify a sausage/triangle course. See Appendix 1 for order of rounding marks.
- **9.10. Boats sailing the Round-the–cans course**, sail the course on the Starboard side of the committee boat
- **9.11.** Boats sailing the windward-Leeward course (handicap 1100 or lower), sail an upwind / downwind course S.S.I. 9.13, Figure 1
- 9.12. Upwind / Downwind courses:





- 9.12.1. Mark 1 will normally be an additional outer windward mark. The Race Committee may specify Mark 1 to be the Windward mark displayed on the starboard side of the committee boat.
- 9.12.2. When an outer windward mark is in use, this will be indicated by the Committee Boat displaying Flag 'W' throughout the start sequences and for the duration of the race.
- **9.12.3.** Asymmetric boats shall sail upwind/downwind courses using the leeward course mark specified on the starboard side of the Committee Boat.
- 9.12.4. The windward-leeward course to be sailed will NOT be listed on the Committee Boat.

10. MARKS

- **10.1.** The approximate position of Club marks is shown on the Club course card.
- 10.2. 'Special' marks as mentioned in Course and Course Instructions, S.S.I. 9.2, will be either Dan buoys (displaying flags) or plain yellow or orange inflatable marks, EXCEPT for marks to be rounded exclusively by boats sailing windward-leeward courses, which will be distinguished by a chequered band or flag.



11. OBSTRUCTIONS

- **11.1.** The Start/ Finish line and the upwind gate on the port side of the committee boat shall be treated as an obstruction to boats sailing to a leeward course mark.
- **11.2.** The prohibited area at the west end of the water, whose boundary is a line of buoys forming its eastern boundary.
- **11.3.** Any boat actively fishing and an area extending 20 metres in any direction from it.
- **11.4.** A safety boat in close attendance to a small craft or competitor in difficulty. 12.THE START

12.1. The starting line will be between the mast on the Committee boat flying an orange flag and a Dan buoy carrying an orange flag.

- orange flag and a Dan buoy carrying an orange flag.

 12.2. To alert boats that a race will begin soon, the orange starting line flag will be
- displayed with multiple sound signals at least one minute before a warning signal is made.

 12.3. Races will be started by displaying numeral boards with classes starting at 2
- minute intervals. This modifies RRS 26. Details of the start sequence and signals are shown in Appendix 2a.
- **12.4.** Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.
- **12.5.** A boat starting later than **2** minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start (DNS) without a hearing. This changes RRS A4.
- **12.6.** Individual recalls will be signalled by displaying Flag X in accordance with RRS 29.1, except that the flag shall be removed no later than one minute after the starting signal.
- **12.7.** A General Recall will be signalled by displaying the "First substitute" for a period of one minute.
- **12.8.** A recalled start shall start 2 minutes after the last scheduled start of that race this modifies RRS 29.2.
- **12.9.** RRS 30.4 will apply to all recalled starts except that the Black flag shall not be displayed.
- **12.10.** In the event of a General Recall on a previously recalled start the restart will be 2 minutes after the last (or recalled) start. This modifies RRS 29.2.
- **12.11.** In the event of a postponement after the Preparatory Signal by displaying pennant AP, the numeral board is removed for re-use. The sequence will be restarted one minute after the removal of AP by re-displaying the numeral board and resuming the one minute sequence. This modifies the interpretation of Race Signal AP in the Racing Rules of Sailing.

13. CHANGE OF THE NEXT LEG OF THE COURSE (Does not apply) 14. THE FINISH

- **14.1.** Boats with a Club handicap >1199, will sail one lap only. They will finish at the end of their first lap without the flag 'S' being displayed and their time recorded.
- 14.2. The remaining boats will finish after approximately 45 minutes (or at the Race Officer's discretion) Flag 'S' plus two sound signals will signify that the race is to be finished.
- **14.3.** Each boat will be finished as it passes through the 'gate' to complete the lap that it is sailing when the race is shortened.
- 14.4. In handicap fleets, the number of completed laps and the total elapsed time will be recorded. The time, averaged by lap for each boat and corrected using the agreed Club handicap number, determines the overall result.



- 14.5. Race results for the D Zero Class, Solo Class and Laser Classes will be determined by finishing positions when the leading boat in each start crosses the finish line after the race has been shortened, recognising the number of laps completed.
- **14.6.** The finish line will be between the mast of the Committee boat flying an orange flag and the 'gate' as described in S.S.I. 9.6.
- **14.7.** After finishing, boats shall keep clear of both finishing gates and of all boats that are continuing to race.



APPENDIX 1

Triangle/sausage (TS)

A triangular course with one side in a windward direction.

Marks may be pillar buoys or Dan buoys

Marks shall be rounded as follows -

- 0 Start Gate
- 1 Windward
- 2 Reaching
- 3 Leeward
- 4 Start Gate
- 5 Windward
- 6 Leeward
- 7 Start gate

Marks 0-7 constitute 1 lap. Repeat marks 1 - 7 until finishing signal is made from Committee boat. Boats may be finished when passing through the start gate after rounding either Mark 3 or Mark 6.

CLUB marks may also be used to signify a "Triangle/sausage" course, e.g. R,W,C,-TS. R =windward, W =reaching, C = leeward.

Alternatively the course could be indicated by displaying R,W,C,R,C.

Sausage / Triangle ST

A triangular course with one side in a windward direction.

Marks may be pillar buoys or Dan buoys

Marks shall be rounded as follows -

- 0 Start Gate
- 1 Windward
- 2 Leeward
- 3 Start Gate
- 4 Windward
- 5 Reaching
- 6 Leeward7 Start gate
- Marks 0-7 constitute 1 lap. Repeat marks 1 7 until finishing signal is made from Committee boat. Boats may be finished when passing through the start gate after rounding either Mark 2 or Mark 6.

CLUB marks may also be used to signify a "sausage/triangle" course, e.g. R,C,W - ST. R = windward, C = leeward, W = reaching.

Alternatively the course could be indicated by displaying R,C,R,W,C

APPENDIX 3 - STARTING SIGNALS USING Numeral Boards (Manual or Electronic)

This system describes the starting procedure mentioned in SI 12.

Numbers displayed on boards on the committee boat shall be changed with a sound signal every minute beginning with the numeral .

Times shall be taken from the visual signals; the absence of a sound signal shall be disregarded.
