

Notice of Race: 2020 Sunday Morning Winter Series Every Sunday from 6th December to 28th January.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing, the RYA prescriptions and the rules of the individual competitor's Class Association.
- 1.2. The Grafham Water Sailing Club Sailing Instructions (S.I.) will apply except as stated in any supplementary Sailing Instructions (S.S.I.).
- 1.3. Before competing, each helm must enter using the Grafham Water Sailing Club WebCollect facility.
- 2. ADVERTISING shall comply with ISAF Regulation 20 and the relevant rules of the individual competitor's Class Association. Grafham Water Sailing Club may require the display of advertising material.
- 3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY
 - 3.1. The ISAF Sailor Classification Code shall not apply to this event.
 - 3.2. Entry to the Series is open to the members of Grafham Water Sailing Club.
- 4. STARTS. The starts for classes will be combined as follows:

Start 1	 Boats sailing windward/leeward course (handicap 1100 or lower)
Start 2	Fast handicap around-the-cans (handicap 1000 or lower)
Start 3	Flying Fifteen (one or two crew)
	 Slow two-handed club handicap 1001 and above together with asymmetric mono hull boats with a Club handicap of 1100 and above
Start 4	Laser

Start 5	D Zero
	• Solo
	Slow single-handed club handicap 1001 and above

The Race Officer, on the day, according to the number of entrants and the weather prevailing, may reduce the number of starts to one.

5. RESULTS AND PRIZES

- 5.1. Prizes for the series are to be awarded to:
 - 5.1.1.Flying Fifteen (the FF15 results will be extracted from the two-handed slow handicap results).
 - 5.1.2.Laser, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7
 - 5.1.3.D Zero

5.1.4.Solo

- 5.1.5. Multihull and asymmetric multihull
- 5.1.6.Asymmetric mono hull,
- 5.1.7.All-comers (handicap) fast
- 5.1.8.Two handed (handicap) slow.
- 5.1.9. Single handed (handicap) slow
- 5.2. The prize giving for the series will be as soon as practical after morning racing on 28th January 2020.
- 6. SCHEDULE AND RACING FORMAT

The series is scheduled to have three races per day. The warning signal for the first race of each day will not occur before 10h57. Each day, the second race will be sailed as soon as practical after the finish of Race1 and the third race will be sailed as soon as practical after the finish of Race2.

- 6.1. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND SCORING
 - 6.1.1.Sailing Instructions will be posted online.
 - 6.1.2. The number of races to count in each series shall be 1 + 30% of the number of races (fractions will be rounded up) available in that series. A minimum of one boat completing a race will ensure that race is available to count towards the series.
 - 6.1.3.Race Officers and duty crews will be awarded average points for the event. The average will be calculated from all of the races sailed which resulted in a finish.
- 6.2. COURSES.
 - 6.2.1. D Zero & Solo Class boats may sail courses different to the other boats in start five.
 - 6.2.2.A windward /leeward course for boats with a handicap below 1100.
 - 6.2.3. The Sailing Instructions encourage Race Officers to set windward marks, for boats sailing the windward/leeward course, different to the other races.
