Spreading of the coronavirus by person to person contact	Members of staff, club members and visitors	A physical assessment of all working areas in the club has been conducted to ensure all areas comply with the Government's social distancing guidelines and recommendations. This is to ensure when staff are at work, they are able to work safely within the guidelines. A perspex screen has been erected between the two desks in the office. Face coverings are available for staff who wish to wear them who do not have their own. Home working continues for members of staff when appropriate As far as possible a maximum of two people are in the office at one time. Introduction of one-way pedestrian routes within the clubhouse: Toilets: enter via the front outside doors and leave via the fire exit. Inside doors to front and rear stainvells to remain locked. Showers and changing rooms are out of use. One-way system through the café and restriction on the number of people inside All café doors and windows to be kept open as far as possible when in use One-way system in the front stairwell for member/visitor access to the office Physical access to the office by non-staff is prevented by the installation of a half-door with counter. Hand sanitiser and a bell to attract attention are provided The remainder of the clubhouse is closed to non-staff. Only staff members and approved volunteers are allowed in the coxswain's shed. All club members and visitors are required to comply with the law on groups of no more than six people or two households when on shore. Two metre separation to be maintained on the slipways, with signage and distance marking in place Rescue will be in extremis, for life-saving operations only. Face coverings to be used for safety crew and casualty (if conscious) during rescue. Coxswain is equipped and trained for PPE use when resuscitating a casualty	Y
