

Notice of Race: 2020 Sunday Leap Year Special Series Every Sunday from 2nd February to 23rd February.

1. RULES

- 1.1. The regatta will be governed by the Racing Rules of Sailing, the RYA prescriptions and the rules of the individual competitor's Class Association.
- 1.2. The Grafham Water Sailing Club Sailing Instructions (S.I.) will apply except as stated in any supplementary Sailing Instructions (S.S.I.).
- 2. ADVERTISING shall comply with ISAF Regulation 20 and the relevant rules of the individual competitor's Class Association. Grafham Water Sailing Club may require the display of advertising material.
- 3. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY
 - 3.1. The ISAF Sailor Classification Code shall not apply to this event.
 - 3.2. Entry to the Series is open to the members of Grafham Water Sailing Club.
- 4. STARTS. The starts for classes will be combined as follows:

Start 1	Multihull
	All-comers fast club handicap (1000 or lower)
	 Mono hull boats with asymmetric spinnaker rig (handicap 1110 or lower)
Start 2	Slow two-handed club handicap 1001 and above together with asymmetric mono hull boats with a Club handicap of 1100 and above
Start 3	D Zero
	• Laser
	Slow single-handed club handicap 1001 and above

The Race Officer, on the day, according to the number of entrants and the weather prevailing, may reduce the number of starts to one.

5. RESULTS AND PRIZES

- 5.1. Prizes for the series are to be awarded to:
 - 5.1.1.Flying Fifteen (the FF15 results will be extracted from the two-handed slow handicap results).
 - 5.1.2.Laser, Laser Radial, Laser 4.7
 - 5.1.3.D Zero
 - 5.1.4. Multihull and asymmetric multihull
 - 5.1.5. Asymmetric mono hull,
 - 5.1.6.All-comers (handicap) fast
 - 5.1.7.Two handed (handicap) slow.

- 5.1.8. Single handed (handicap) slow
- 5.2. The prize giving for the series will be as soon as practical after morning racing on 1st March 2020

6. SCHEDULE AND RACING FORMAT

The series is scheduled to have three races per day. The warning signal for the first race of each day will not occur before 10h57. Each day, the second race will be sailed as soon as practical after the finish of Race1 with the third race as soon as practical after the finish of race 2.

6.1. SAILING INSTRUCTIONS AND SCORING

- 6.1.1. Sailing Instructions will be available in the Club House.
- 6.1.2. The number of races to count in each series shall be 1 + 30% of the number of races (ignoring fractions) available in that series. A minimum of one boat completing a race will ensure that race is available to count towards the series.
- 6.1.3.Race Officers and duty crews will be awarded average points for the event. The average will be calculated from all of the races sailed which resulted in a finish.

6.2. COURSES.

- 6.2.1. D Zero Class and Laser Class boats may sail courses different to the other boats in start three.
- 6.2.2.A windward /leeward course for mono hull boats with asymmetric spinnakers will be sailed.
- 6.2.3. A windward /leeward course for multi hull boats with asymmetric spinnakers will be sailed.
 - 6.2.3.1. The symmetric and other Catamarans may opt to enter and sail this windward/leeward course.
- 6.2.4. The Sailing Instructions allow Race Officers to set windward marks for a **symmetric spinnaker catamarans** & **asymmetric spinnaker mono hull** boats different to the other races.
