Sunday Summer Series Results

Covid-19 Update (at Grafham!)

From Friday 18th September, the club is required to keep a record of everyone who visits the site for Track and Trace purposes. We are using an RYA-recommended App that has been developed for the hospitality industry for this. Each time you visit the club, please scan the QR code displayed on posters around the site, using your phone's camera. This will take you to a website where you can enter your details. The information will be stored securely for 21 days and then destroyed. If you arrive with others, only one member of the group needs to do this. If you can't scan the QR code, go to registerdetails.com/Z7c in your browser, or there is a paper signing in log at the entrance to the cafe.
